



## LD BC New Jetty Usage Guide and Rates

As we work towards getting our new jetties up and running, the Committee would like to share the following information about how we propose to use and charge for them in the future.

- Anyone choosing to leave their boats on the boat club jetties (berth holder or visitor) do so at their own risk.
- All boats moored on the jetties must have adequate insurance to cover damage caused to other boat users and/or the jetties and club premises.
- Permanent berths will be charged at £250 per metre per annum.
- The minimum berth size will be calculated on the length of boat plus 1.2 metres (for clearance) calculated to the next metre.
- Members can choose to pay for a bigger berth, if the ideal size is not available.
- Anyone taking a permanent berth must agree to pay for their electricity by way of a metered cable, which will be obtained from the club for a deposit (refundable on surrender of berth and return of same metered cable).
- Permanent mooring holders must accept that visitors will be allowed to raft up between or alongside. Visitors must agree to access the jetties by only crossing the berthed boat forward of their mast/cockpit.
- Visitors should only raft up against similar sized boats in terms of tonnage to prevent drag or damage to a lighter boat.
- Visitors are required to contact the owner of any boat that they are blocking in to accommodate their required usage for the length of the visitor's stay.
- Visiting boat owners are not allowed to leave their boats unattended without the permission of the boat owners' they are rafted against/blocking in or a Flag Officer.
- There will be a £5 per day charge for any visiting boat wishing to use the club's electricity (otherwise visiting members can moor for free).
- Existing berth holders (A Thackray & J Wragg, C Edwards, G Farrimond and R Varley) will be given priority to renew their mooring agreement, following that, the remaining permanent berths will be offered out to other members.
- Lakeland Adventures will occupy the 2 end berths on the North jetty as agreed by the Directors.
- Anyone wishing to be considered for a mooring for the period from 1st April 2020 to 31st March 2021 should contact the Commodore, Les Lansley by email at [Les.lansley@gmail.com](mailto:Les.lansley@gmail.com) with your boat L.O.A., beam and draft **by Friday 13 March 2020** so that berths may be allocated at the Committee meeting on the 14 March 2020.
- The Committee will allocate the spaces for the new jetties, in the first instance, based on a combination of the following criteria: length of membership; length, beam and draft of boat; and fit to maximise the jetty usage. In future years a waiting list process will be used in addition.
